To the Product Type textile we also count the Neopren clothes.

1.1 ACTIVITY (AC) TEXTILE

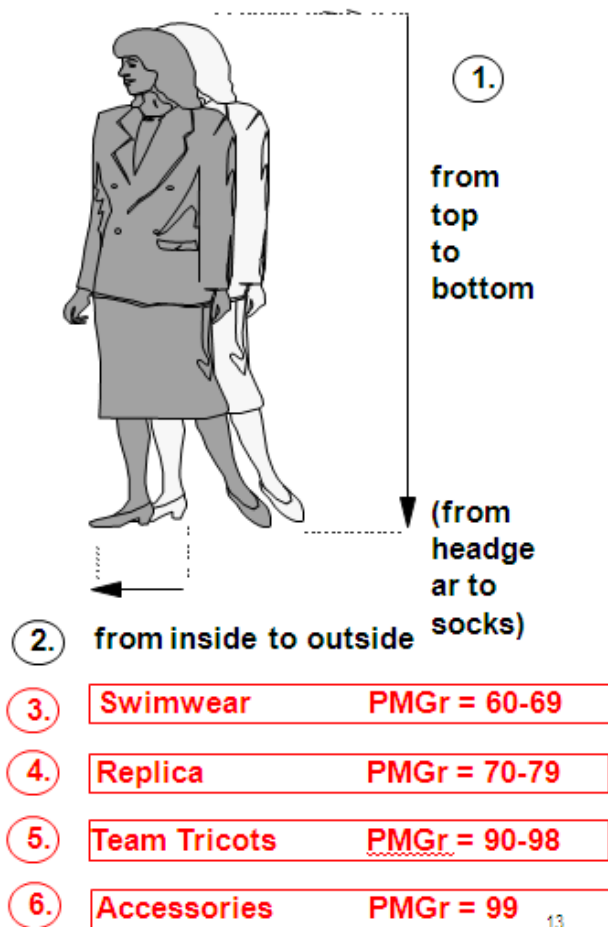
The area of leisure is divided into two AC.

- 14 = Leisure / fashion winter
- 75 = Leisure / fashion summer and all year

1.2 PRODUCT MAIN GROUP (PMGR), GENERAL COMMENTS

All product main groups of the product type textile are clearly divided. That means, that the product main group is only used for each type of the product and they repeat themselves in all AC where needed.

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1.3 PRODUCT SUB GROUP (PSGR), GENERAL COMMENTS

Basically the product main group is divided in top-bottom parts (trousers/pants) but also into Men / Unisex / Ladies and Children.

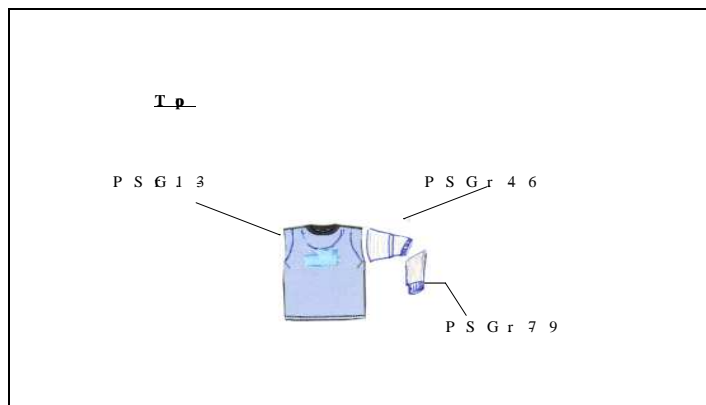

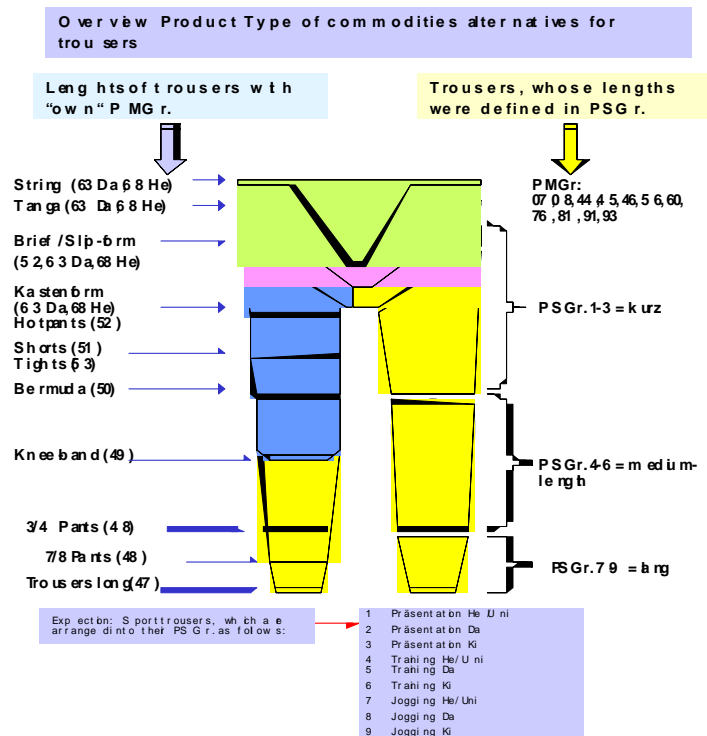

If there PMGr. is not structured in top (upper) and bottom parts were planned (bikinis, shorts, bermudas etc.), the PSGr. will be structured as follows:

- PSGr. 1 short Men/Unisex
- 2 short Ladies
- 3 short Children
- 4 medium-length Men/Unisex
- 5 medium-length Ladies
- 6 medium-length Children
- 7 long Men/Unisex
- 8 long Ladies
- 9 long Children

Allocation of one-piece suits

The following PMGr. refers to the designations of legs, which are medium-long and long.

PMGr. 31 = Overalls

PMGr. 69 = Swimming suits

1.4 SPECIAL INFORMATION TO INDIVIDUAL GOOD-KEYS

1.4.1 NEOPREN / LYCRA

On the following experience ranges of the Product Type textile, the PMGr. and PSGr. are only opened for neoprene and/or Lycra of products intended.

- AC 16 = Windsurfing
- AC 17 = Diving
- AC 18 = Waterski
- AC 21 = Kayak, Canoe

1.4.2 -GLOVES

All gloves are defined as textiles, the only exceptions are in following activity ranges:

- AC 08 Eishockey
- AC 32 Football (Goalie-gloves)
- AC 37 Baseball
- AC 80 Boxing

1.4.3 DIFFERENCE FOR UNDERWEAR

Underwear is allocated to the PMGr 06 and 07.

1) functional underwear (humidity transport etc.) will be assigned to the activity "Multisport" (code=00) with the exception of Bike underwear, which is allocated to the activity "Bike" (code=60)

2) General/fashionable underwear fashionable wear („Dessous“) cotton will be assigned on Activity Leisure/Fashion summer (code. 75) and winter (code 14).cotton

Not the material is controlling the allocation of the "Activity" but the function/utilization.

1.4.4 UNDER JACKETS PMGR. = 28

Under jackets are assigned, when they are worn mainly under the outer clothes (jackets, coats etc.). Example: Cardigans, Sweat jackets, **Nickijacken** etc.

1.4.5 BODIES

In version 2, the PMGr. 10 is intended for Bodies as underwear.

1.4.6 TRIATHLONBODIES, RUNNINGBODIES, ATHLETIC BODIES

Are not to arrange under 2.xx.10.x (10 belongs to the range “laundry,,), but has to be arranged separately under 2.xx.31.x.

1.4.7 “SPORTS SUITS” PMGR. = 33

Presentation suit = are sports suits with open leg

Trainings suit = are sports suits in wedge form

Jogging suit = are sports suits with waistbands

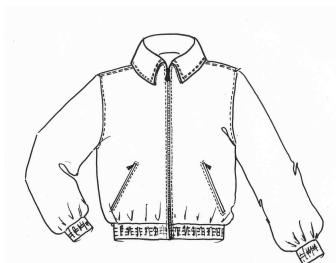

1.4.8 DIFFERENCE BETWEEN BLOUSON AND JACKETS

- 1) Blouson (bomber jacket) = Waist closing on hip (2.xx.36.), back length Unisex/Men till 74cm and Ladies till 62cm
- 2) Jackets = longer crotch, open closing (2.xx.37.)

1.4.9 MULTI-FUNCTION JACKETS

These are jackets with a diaphragm and/or highly technical functions.

1.4.10 VESTS

Vests are Gilets or Spencers, are sleeveless waistcoats and can be opened (with zipper or row of buttons).



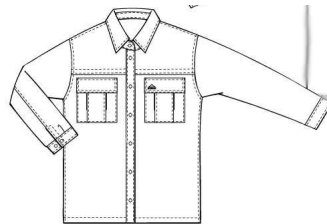
1.4.11 DIFFERENCE BETWEEN POLO / BUTTON SHIRT

- 1) Polo = 98 % of knitted material and only half buttoned
- 2) Button shirt = Always buttoned

2.15.69 Swimming suits = Used for competition, functional materials, and design

PMGr. 68 trunks refer to closely fitting trousers of flexible material.
 PMGr. 67 swimming shorts refer to low-cut trousers with interior slip.

1.4.16 FAN ARTICLE / REPLICA

Individual articles are assigned to the respective EB.

Which textiles products belong to PMGr „Fan“or „Replica“?

- Bayern München jersey = AC „Fan“
- Cycling jersey „Team Telekom“ and as well jersey with famous bikers like „Jan Ullrich“ will be defined as Replica or Team dress.
- A product singed of a biker **does not** belong to „Fan article“.

1.4.17 „FAN“ ARTICLES WON'T BE USED FOR ACTIVE OPERATION OF SPORTS. THESE ARE “REPRODUCTIONS” FROM ORIGINAL TEAM CLOTHES OF ACQUAINTANCE FOOTBALL-/BASKETBALL-/ETC. TEAMS. „SPORTS PANTS“ PMGR. = 43

Presentation trousers = are trousers with open leg

Training trousers = sport trousers in wedge form

Jogging trousers = sport trousers with waist

1.4.18 BIKE TEAM TROUSERS

The PMGr. Bike team trousers (PMGr. 91) are used only for “bike shorts” with crew print.

1.4.19 SWEAT BANDS/FOREHEAD BANDS

The head-sweat-bands have to be assigned within the respective experience range in PMGr. 02 / PSGr. 1-3. The wrist-sweat-bands have to be assigned in FEDAS 2.xx.99.8.
